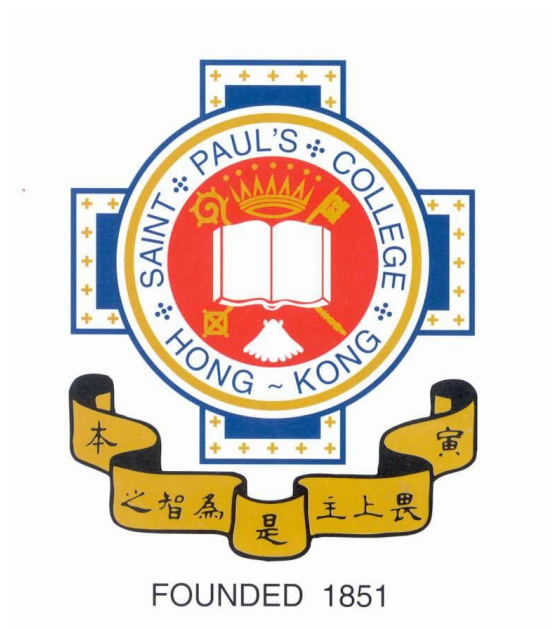

A. School Information

1. School Motto and Mission

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom

The school is managed by the St. Paul's College Council which is a body incorporated by special ordinance. The mission of the School as stated in the ordinance is: the offering to Hong Kong students of a modern, liberal education founded upon Christian principles, Protestant and Evangelical, as professed by the Sheng Kung Hui.

2. College Council

The College Council is established under the St. Paul's College Council Incorporation Ordinance. There are eighteen members in 2010-2011.

3. Class Structure

St. Paul's College Primary School is a whole-day primary boys' school affiliated to St. Paul's College, both under the Direct Subsidy Scheme. There are 6 levels from Junior Class 1 to Junior Class 6, with 3 classes at each level.

The number of pupils on roll in September 2010 stood at 547, with three classes per level from primary one to primary six.

B. Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns

1. Improve teaching and student learning

1.1 To enhance quality capabilities for e-learning, and teaching and learning

- 1.1.1 The intranet system was tested, upgraded and useful links were added to the different learning areas.
- 1.1.2 An e-payment system was put up and tested and will be implemented.
- 1.1.3 An SMS system was launched for sending parents important messages. Teachers and parents found it effective.
- 1.1.4 A new server was set up to replace the old one.
- 1.1.5 A redundancy system was set up to back up the school's computer server.
- 1.1.6 An online video server for Campus TV was set up.

1.2 To uphold the quality of student learning in all areas

- 1.2.1 The Chinese curriculum using Putonghua as the medium of instruction was reviewed. Pinyin skills and knowledge was strengthened to lay a good foundation for JC1 to JC3 students and prepare them for learning Chinese in Putonghua in full scale in JC4.
- 1.2.2 According to the TSA results, our students still have room for improvement in Speaking Assessment (Putonghua). Two Putonghua Teaching Assistants were deployed to enrich the language learning context for students.

1.3 To strengthen project learning in all subject areas

- 1.3.1 Peer assessment and self assessment in project learning were reviewed and improved.
- 1.3.2 Project presentation and display were strengthened.

1.4 To strengthen self-regulated learning

- 1.4.1 The goal-setting and progress checking programmes in all subject areas were reviewed and improved.
- 1.4.2 Students were provided access to learning materials and extended study activities through the Intranet. Useful links were also added to strengthen self-regulated learning.

1.5 To implement a 5-year gifted education Programme

- 1.5.1 The Gifted Education Focus Group was established to plan, implement, co-ordinate, monitor and assess all the school-based gifted development programmes.
- 1.5.2 The Gifted Education Manual was review and revised.

- 1.5.3 Whole-class enrichment operation model (*Level 1A – see Appendix: Three-tiered Implementation Model) was implemented. Higher-order thinking questioning was used in the lesson, problem solving and critical thinking skills were strengthened to arouse students’ thinking and expand their scope of learning.
 - 1.5.4 Whole-class domain-focused model (*Level 1B) was implemented. The Enhancement and Remedial Programme in English, Chinese and mathematics was reviewed. Students were carefully screened to enter the respective programme.
 - 1.5.5 Pull-out programmes of generic nature (*Level 2A) were arranged.
 - 1.5.6 Pull-out programmes for students with specific talents (*Level 2B) were arranged.
 - 1.5.7 Off-site individualized support for the exceptionally gifted (*Level 3) was arranged.
- 1.6 To continue to foster good reading habit
- 1.6.1 Reading materials at different corners of the school for easy access to books and periodicals were provided and enriched.
 - 1.6.2 Use of class library cabinet was encouraged. New books are put up annually.
- 1.7 To keep teachers abreast of education development
- 1.7.1 One Senior Teacher completed a course for middle management. The other senior teachers will attend courses in the coming year.
 - 1.7.2 Four sessions of group training for all teachers were arranged by the school.

2. Strengthen student support

- 2.1 To strengthen students’ sense of responsibility at home, in school, in the community, in their own country and in the world
 - 2.1.1 The second cycle of the whole school guidance programme Phase 2 – Love My Family Love My School was completed.
- 2.2 To strengthen class management and care given to students
 - 2.2.1 The double class teacher system was developed and the feedback from teachers and parents was positive.
- 2.3 To enhance teaching staff’s capability in catering for special education needs (SEN) of students
 - 2.3.1 Teachers were provided with necessary training opportunities in catering for SEN of students.
 - 2.3.2 Three teachers completed courses on education of students with special educational needs.
 - 2.3.3 Three more teachers will attend the above mentioned courses in 2011-2012.

3. Sustain School improvement / development in line with Primary School expansion plan from 18 to 24 classes.

3.1 Quality assurance in all aspects of the School

3.1.1 School Self-Evaluation (SSE) incorporating stakeholder surveys were completed.

3.2 Good maintenance of the current school building and its facilities

3.2.1 School used its own fund to repair the spalling concrete and rusted metal gates. Areas containing asbestos material were labelled by certified consultant. Repainting of external wall was pending.

3.3 Relocation of the school from Hill Road to the Pok Fu Lam Road / Victoria Road new campus

3.3.1-2 Monthly reports were still delayed, but school was allowed to attend the monthly meeting with the ArchSD and consultants. SEN of students.

3.3.3 Only one visit was arranged so far; the school was informed that the completion date would now be end of May 2012, a delay of 120 days.

3.4 Expansion of school size from 18 classes to 24 classes

3.4.1 Application to restructure the school size was sent in February 2011 but was formally disapproved by the EDB in April. 96 students will be admitted in JC1 for application the 2012-2013 school year; application for school expansion will be sent to the EdB again one year later.

C. Our Learning and Teaching

1. Curriculum Development

The “Five-year Gifted Education Programme” was newly launched this year. To cater for our gifted learners, higher order thinking approach was adopted across learning disciplines. Moreover, extended activities and training programmes have been created to enrich the learning experience of our boys.

Self-evaluation and curriculum improvement continued to be a crucial part. Since September 2007, our Curriculum Development Mistress has been visiting classes on a regular basis to give feedback to teachers on how to make teaching more interesting and effective.

This year, our enrichment programme in mathematics and English continued to cover J.C. 2 – J.C. 6 and J.C. 1 – J.C. 6 respectively. Boys were streamed and had lessons in relatively smaller groups once every week in order that the learnt material could be enhanced and consolidated.

Since September 2006, our J.C. 4 boys have been learning Chinese in Putonghua. Putonghua continued to be the medium of instruction in the teaching of Chinese in J.C. 4 to J.C. 6 in our school in 2010-2011. We carefully monitored the performance of the boys both in the daily lessons and in assessments. With the help of two native-speaking Putonghua teachers, we found that students were more and more interested and confident in using Putonghua inside and outside the classroom.

Project learning has always been a core element in the learning of general studies. As part of our ongoing efforts to improve the learning experience for our students, we invited an expert from the Education Bureau to conduct workshops and meetings for our teachers to enhance the knowledge and skills of designing and implementing project according to the ability of students and the objectives set. This enabled project-learning to be achieved more effectively, and students were able to derive a wider range of skills from more focused projects. Students were encouraged to take part in different types of contests related to general studies, especially in science and history. Two students from J.C. 6 were given the First Class Honour in the Hong Kong Budding Scientists Award (2010-2011), organised by the Education Bureau targeting gifted students. One of them also won the Third Class Honour in the International Junior Science Olympiad (Secondary School section).

To promote self-regulated learning, our school arranged thirty students to take part in an online learning programme, coordinated by the Education Bureau. The participating students expressed that they had wonderful experience and fun in it.

Music teachers carried out the “Programme for the Musically Gifted”, with an aim to stream students into various vocal, choral and instrumental training activities. “Creativity Workshop” was incorporated into the curriculum to foster creative and appreciative skills among our boys.

The religious education curriculum has been reviewed and Christian ethics continued to be the foci. To cultivate a sense of love and care among the boys, the school continued to join the St. John’s Cathedral Grand Raffle Ticket Sale, and Christmas Gifts Campaign of the Samaritan’s Purse and Supporting the Growth and Development of Underprivileged Children in Hong Kong Campaign of the Lions Club of Mid-levels. We also joined the Hong Kong Red Cross – Wishes for Japanese Campaign to show our support to the earthquake victims. The Christian teachers also set up a prayer-collection box to encourage students to pray for the needy and the people who suffered from diseases and were victims of disasters. Some boys were trained to be assembly leaders to lead the prayers and hymn singing to praise the Lord.

This year, we arranged our “young philosophers” from J.C. 4 to J.C. 6 to join the “Philosophy for Children” class, a pilot programme jointly organised by the HKU and the HKIEd professors. The objective is to promote logical thinking techniques among students.

We aim to provide quality teaching and an ever-improving curriculum tailor made for our children in an all-round education setting.

2. Development in Information Technology

The integration of I.T. into daily teaching and the boys’ learning has always been a major concern in our school plan. To achieve this, we are committed to maintaining a high standard of equipment and facilities in the classrooms, the Multi-media Learning Centre and the Campus TV Studio. Last year, the school succeeded in applying for the Quality Education Fund and would be allocated \$115,000 in the Use of New Technology for School Administration Work. This year, we started operating the SMS service which was well received by parents. In the following school year, we shall launch e-payment services in which parents can pay expenses for their boys via PPS or e-banking services.

3. Support for Student Development

The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups provided guidance and counselling service for our boys for the fifth year. Our Student Guidance Counsellors conducted talks and workshops in the Growth lessons and organised a series of seminars for teachers and parents. Each seminar focused on a different problem encountered by teachers and parents. The seminars were well received, and after the seminars, follow-up service was rendered to individual parents according to their needs.

To render support in catering for learner diversity, we worked hand in hand with ENT Laser Hearing & Speech Therapy Centre to provide speech training, the Boys' & Girls' Clubs Association of Hong Kong to run the Understanding Adolescence Programme and HK EP Services Centre Ltd. to conduct assessments and follow-up activities. Special homework and assessment policies were in place and reviewed every year in order that the boys who had special needs would be well accommodated.

The second cycle of our whole school guidance approach "Love My Family, Love My School" was launched. The Discipline & Guidance team implemented a series of activities to strengthen the boys' role in serving their own families and the School. Activities like "Tips for an Environmentally-friendly Schools" and "Love My Family, Love My School – Lyric Writing Competition" aimed to motivate the boys in taking up responsibility both at home and in school as well as showing love to others. In line with the "Five-Year Gifted Education Programme", the Gifted Education Taskforce was established. Different subject panel heads, supported the Discipline and Guidance Team, designed tailor made learning programmes for the boys concerned.

4. Staff Development

In order to keep themselves abreast of the latest development in learning and teaching, subject knowledge, curriculum planning, information and technology, education policies, etc., teachers attended courses, seminars, workshops, briefing sessions and experience sharing sessions. Apart from engaging themselves in degree awarding courses individually, they participated in training sessions in small groups and as a whole school. The topics included
