## **A. School Information**

### **1. School Motto and Mission**

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom

The school is managed by the St. Paul's College Council which is a body incorporated by special ordinance. The mission of the School as stated in the ordinance is: the offering to Hong Kong students of a modern, liberal education founded upon Christian principles, Protestant and Evangelical, as professed by the Sheng Kung Hui.

### **2. College Council**

The College Council is established under the St. Paul's College Council Incorporation Ordinance. There are eighteen members in 2009-2010.

### **3. Class Structure**

St. Paul's College Primary School is a whole-day primary boys' school affiliated to St. Paul's College, both under the Direct Subsidy Scheme. There are 6 levels from Junior Class 1 to Junior Class 6, with 3 classes at each level.

The number of pupils on roll in September 2009 stood at 544, with three classes per level from primary one to primary six.

## **B. Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns**

### **1. Improve teaching and student learning**

- 1.1 To enhance quality capabilities for e-learning, and teaching and learning
  - 1.1.1 A new monitoring system was established; facilities and equipment for ICT in all learning areas were inspected, catalogued and entered in the inventory list.
  - 1.1.2 The school's computer network and system were upgraded.
  - 1.1.3 Visualizers were installed in all classrooms
  - 1.1.4 Out-dated computers were replaced with new ones
- 1.2 To uphold the quality of student learning in all areas
  - 1.2.1 The Putonghua curriculum in junior classes was reviewed, plans were made according to evaluation.
  - 1.2.2 "Putonghua as the medium of instruction in upper primary classes" was reviewed by means of parent and student questionnaires only. The TSA supposed to be held in June 2009 was cancelled due to the flu epidemic, and therefore data in public exams could be not collected for reference.
  - 1.2.3 Seventy J. C. 5 students and four parent volunteers went on Paul's Action in March 2010.
  - 1.2.4 Seventy-one JC4 students, sixty-three parents and five teachers visited Chung Ying Street Shenzhen in June 2010, together with two officers from the EdB as observers.
  - 1.2.5 Regular English activities went on – Drama Club for J. C. 4-6 and English Club for J. C. 1-3
- 1.3 To strengthen project learning in all subject areas
  - 1.3.1 Assessment in project learning in all subject areas, especially in general studies was implemented.
  - 1.3.2 Peer assessment and self assessment in project learning were carried out in some classes only. Further support from teachers would be needed in this area.
- 1.4 To strengthen self-regulated learning
  - 1.4.1 The goal-setting and progress checking programmes in all subject areas were only partly achieved. More effort should be put forth to implement the programme.
  - 1.4.2 Students were provided with access to more learning materials and extended study activities through the Intranet.

- 1.5 To implement a 5-year gifted education Programme
  - 1.5.1 The Enhancement and Remedial Programme in English, Chinese and mathematics was reviewed. Students were carefully screened to enter the respective programme.
  - 1.5.2 A Gifted Education Focus Group was formed.
  - 1.5.3 A Gifted Education Reference Manual was completed and uploaded on the intranet for teachers' reference.
  - 1.5.4 Whole-class enrichment operation model (\*Level 1A – see Appendix: Three-tiered Implementation Mode) was implemented.
  - 1.5.5 Pull-out programmes of generic nature (\*Level 2A) was arranged.
  - 1.5.6 Pull-out programmes for students with specific talents (\*2B) was arranged.
  - 1.5.7 Off-site individualised support for the exceptionally gifted (\*Level 3) was arranged.
  
- 1.6 To continue to foster good reading habit
  - 1.6.1 Reading materials at different corners of the school for easy access to books and periodicals were provided.
  - 1.6.2 Use of the class library cabinet was encouraged.

## **2. Strengthen student support**

- 2.1 To strengthen students' sense of responsibility at home, in school, in the community, in their own country and in the world
  - 2.1.1 The second cycle of the whole school guidance programme Phase 1 – Service Starts from Home was completed.
  
- 2.2 To strengthen class management and care given to students
  - 2.2.1 The single class teacher system was reviewed, and the need for double class teachers was confirmed.
  
- 2.3 To enhance teaching staff's capability in catering for special education needs (SEN) of students
  - 2.3.1 Teachers were provided with necessary training opportunities in catering for SEN of students

2.4 To raise the level of student achievement in all learning areas

2.4.1 Resources to cater for needs of SEN students were allocated to the following :

- Speech therapy
- UPA (Understanding Adolescence Project)
- Education psychologist service

**3. Sustain School improvement / development in line with the Primary School expansion plan from 18 to 24 classes**

3.1 To review all aspects of the School's operations

3.1.1 School Self-Evaluation (SSE) incorporating stakeholder surveys were completed.

3.2 Good maintenance of the current school building and its facilities

3.2.1 Application for government funds for the removal of asbestos containing material, repair of spalling concrete, repair of rusted metal gates and repainting of external walls was sent but declined by the EdB.

3.2.2 Detailed proposal for the above, with the help of Project Manager and Consultant, was sent to the EdB for reconsideration of the application, but the reply was negative.

School used its own fund to carry out the major repair works in July and August 2010.

3.3 Relocation of the school from Hill Road to the Pok Fu Lam Road / Victoria Road new campus

3.3.1 Two CICs (client Initiated Change) were submitted to the EdB and ArchSD to enhance the facilities in the new campus to cope with school expansion. A sum of top-up funds was paid.

3.3.2 Study for add-on facilities to the campus with the help of Project Manager and Consultant was in progress.

3.3.3 School requested for the monthly report from the EdB / ArchSD / Consultant but encountered difficulty in obtaining the reports on time. The EdB and the ArchSD kept communication with the school minimal, making it difficult for the school to monitor progress of the building project.

3.4 Expansion of school size from 18 classes to 24 classes

3.4.1 96 students in JC1 (32 per class) were admitted since September 2009.

## **C. Our Learning and Teaching**

### **1. Curriculum Development**

Self-evaluation and curriculum improvement continued to be a crucial part of our school development programme. Since September 2007, Miss Mai Man Ling, Curriculum Development Mistress, has been visiting classes on a regular basis to give feedback to teachers on how to make teaching more interesting and effective. We aim to provide quality teaching and an ever-improving curriculum for the children who join our school and learn with us.

This year, our enrichment programme in mathematics and English continued to cover JC2 – JC6 and JC1 – JC6 respectively. Led by Mr. Lau Wai Man, Deputy Head and Mathematics Panel Chair, and Mrs. Tong Tsui Wing Ki Anne, English Panel Chair, our Mathematics and English teachers devoted time and effort to providing the boys with the opportunity to excel or to learn more effectively. Boys were streamed and had lessons in relatively smaller groups once every week in order that the learnt material could be enhanced and consolidated.

Since September 2006, our JC4 boys have been learning Chinese in Putonghua. Putonghua continued to be the medium of instruction in the teaching of Chinese in JC4 to JC6 in our school in 2009–2010. We carefully monitored the performance of the boys both in the daily lessons and in assessments, and found that they were more and more interested and confident in using Putonghua inside and outside the classroom.

Project-learning has always been a core element in the learning of general studies. As part of our ongoing efforts to improve the learning experience for our students, for the second year, we invited an expert from the EdB to conduct workshops and meetings for our teachers to enhance the knowledge and skills of designing and implementing project according to the ability of students and the objectives set. This enabled project-learning to be achieved more effectively, and students were able to derive a wider range of skills from more focused projects. Students were encouraged to take part in different types of contests related to general studies, especially in science. Students from JC4-6 won many inter-school contests on Eco-Model Tournament, Liberal Studies and Science. Our team came third in the Hong Kong Budding Scientists Award (2009-2010) which was organised by the Education Bureau for gifted students.

The religious education curriculum has been reviewed and Christian ethics continued to be the foci. The R.E. lessons were enlivened by the visits of Revd. Robert Martin, the College Chaplain. To cultivate a sense of love and care among the boys, the school joined

the St. John's Cathedral Grand Raffle Ticket Sale, and Christmas Gifts Campaign of the Samaritan's Purse and Supporting the Growth and Development of Underprivileged Children in Hong Kong Campaign of the Lions Club of Mid-levels. The Christian teachers also organised the whole-school praying for the needy and the people who contracted HSI and were victims of disasters. Some boys were trained to be assembly leaders to lead the prayers and hymn singing to praise the Lord.

## **2. Development in Information Technology**

The integration of I.T. into daily teaching and the boys' learning has always been a major concern in our school plan. To achieve this, we are committed to maintaining a high standard of equipment and facilities in the classrooms, the Multi-media Learning Centre and the Campus TV Studio. The school has also succeeded in applying for the Quality Education Fund and would be allocated \$115,000 in the Use of New Technology for School Administration Work.

## **3. Support for Student Development**

The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups provided guidance and counselling service for our boys for the fourth year. Mr. Wong Ying Kit and Miss Yeung Ting Yan, Student Guidance Counsellors, conducted talks and workshops in the Growth lessons and organised a series of seminars for teachers and parents. Each seminar focused on a different problem encountered by teachers and parents. The seminars were well received, and after the seminars, follow-up service was rendered to individual parents according to their needs.

To render support in catering for learner diversity, we worked hand in hand with ENT Laser Hearing & Speech Therapy Centre to provide speech training, the Boys' & Girls' Clubs Association of Hong Kong to run the Understanding Adolescence Programme and HK EP Services Centre Ltd. to conduct assessments and follow-up activities. Special homework and assessment policies were in place and reviewed every year in order that the boys who had special needs would be well accommodated.

The second cycle of our whole school guidance approach "Service Starts from Home" was launched. Under the leadership of Mrs. Ho Tai Sau Man, our Discipline and Guidance Mistress, a series of activities was implemented to strengthen the boys' role in serving their own families. Activities like "Thorough Cleaning for Spring" and "Showing my Affection: a Mini-Invention" aimed to motivate the boys in taking up responsibility at home and showing love to their families. A Gifted Education Taskforce was established and a Gifted Education Programme was launched. Different subject panel heads, including the Discipline and Guidance Team will provide the boys with special training.

#### 4. Staff Development

In order to keep themselves abreast of the latest development in learning and teaching, subject knowledge, curriculum planning, information and technology, education policies, etc., teachers attended courses, seminars, workshops, briefing sessions and experience sharing sessions. Apart from engaging themselves in degree awarding courses individually, they participated in training sessions in small groups and as a whole school. The topics included
